

The changes to the school day times

We have now had two weeks of the changes regarding the start of the school day. Thank you for the way that everyone has adapted to the changes. We have noticed in school that the learning is beginning more quickly and purposefully.

As a reminder the children are to be lined up at their classroom door for **8:45am** and to be collected from the door at 3.15pm.

This is so the children can get into class quickly, we advise that any lengthy information that needs passing to teachers is done via a message through the school office, this allows the teachers to quickly engage in teaching with the children.

This week in school we have been trialling having a no football week at break times. There have been some incidents recently where children have become distressed with high levels of emotion during and following football play and so we are exploring with the children other avenues of play at break times. We have plans in school at the moment to move forward and adapt playtimes using a programme called OPAL (Outdoor Play And Learning) and I will update you when we have further information.



Industrial action by the National Education Union NEU

Information was sent out yesterday regarding the planned action by the NEU on Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March.

We have carried out a risk assessment with the knowledge of the number of staff who will be in school and have decided that it is safe for half of the children to come in on each day.

On Wednesday the children who are in St Mark and St Matthew houses are to be in school and on Thursday the children who are in St John and St Luke Houses are to be in. If a child is ill on the day that they are due in and cannot attend school, then an absence call should be made in the usual way as this day as classed as a school day.

The children will be taking part in an additional walk on the afternoon of 30th March 2023. Mr Shepherd (Headteacher) from St Benet Biscop has agreed to let the children walk around the 'Big Field' so that km's can be added to each child's total.
