Jesus, the king of love, showed his love for us and for all people by dying on the cross. We encourage the children to think about how they can show their love for others as Jesus asks us to.

## Statements to Live By

Our Statement to Live By next week is:

I can work, play, rest and pray each day.

The children have been able to reflect today about the meaning of this statement. If we work all the time we get too tired; If we only play all the time we may limit our learning; each day we should spend some time resting and some time in prayer. Can we, as adults, model this with our children?
